Program Information and Scoring Criteria

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The Jenesis Trailblazer Awards™ recognize two exceptional US- or Canada-based researchers or clinicians who have completed innovative research in the fields of pulmonary hypertension (PH), idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis (IPF), or lung transplantation (LTx). A one-time award up to \$5,000 will be issued for professional development and/or training of their choice.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The program will provide recognition to two researchers or clinicians annually – one for the Jenesis Trailblazer Award™ and one for the Jenesis Emerging Trailblazer Award™ which recognizes an early-to-mid career researcher or clinician for innovative contributions to PH, IPF, or LTx. Recipients of these awards will be selected by an independent Scientific Review Committee (SRC), comprised of leaders in the fields of PH, IPF, or LTx. The SRC will review all submitted complete nominations. Recognition of award recipients will be made at events hosted or sponsored by United Therapeutics.

Please refer to the Eligibility for Nomination section below to review the criteria nominees must meet to be considered for an award. Nominations from prior cycles will be considered, pending confirmation from the nominator that the nominee still meets the eligibility criteria.

SCIENTIFIC FOCUS

The program aims to acknowledge and celebrate the development of leaders in the fields of PH, IPF, or LTx and feed the talent pipeline by recognizing them at critical points in their careers.

SCIENTIFIC REVIEW COMMITTEE (SRC)

Applications will be assessed by an independent SRC comprised of leaders in the fields of PH, IPF, or LTx.

ELIGIBILITY NOMINATION

These awards are intended for researchers or clinicians working in the fields of PH, IPF, or LTx.

JENESIS TRAILBLAZER AWARDTM

At the time of nomination submission, nominees must meet the following requirements:

• Hold the title of either Associate Professor or Professor

- Hold a PhD degree or equivalent, or a doctoral-level clinical degree, such as MD, DO, or PharmD
- Be a US or Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or hold a valid nonimmigrant visa. This visa must be valid for the oneyear award period
- Be responsible for providing exceptional patient care or contributing innovative research to the fields of PH, IPF, or LTx

JENESIS EMERGING TRAILBLAZER AWARDTM

At the time of nomination submission, nominees must meet the following requirements:

- Hold a title of no higher rank than Assistant Professor.
 Fellows and instructors are eligible
- Hold a PhD degree or equivalent, or a doctoral-level clinical degree, such as MD, DO, or PharmD
- Be a US or Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or hold a valid nonimmigrant visa
- Be responsible for providing exceptional patient care or contributing innovative research to the fields of PH, IPF, or LTx

NOMINEE REVIEW CRITERIA

Nominees are evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Exhibited scientific/technical/clinical expertise
- · Novelty/innovation of the research
- Potential impact and application of the research or ability to address unmet medical needs
- Impact the nominee may have had on the careers of other researchers or proteges
